BBA members who would like to change their current booth spot(s) or need more spaces, must pre-register, pre-pay, and come in person to the Trade Fair sign-up to be held Saturday, January 21, 2012, from 9:00-9:30 a.m., and move their spot(s), using a lottery system for sign-in.

Members who were not in Trade Fair last year, or paid their dues late, must register in person on Saturday, January 21, 2011, from 9:30-10:00 a.m. Non-members will register from 10:30-11:30 a.m.

Remember: To guarantee last year's spot(s), we **MUST** receive your application and money in full on or before Tuesday, January 17 or your booth spot(s) will go up for sale at the sign-up on January 21. Please bring your completed Trade Fair application in person to the **BBA OFFICE, 8204 SECOR ROAD, LAMBERTVILLE, MI.**

Please note: The price for BBA members for a regular booth is \$200, and \$250 for a booth in the new gym. Non-member booths are \$400 and \$450. Snow tires – so why would I want them?

Today's tires that come on new cars are superior to tires of just 15 years ago. However, we must remember, only a small portion of the tires actually make contact with the road. It is important to realize that regardless if you drive a front wheel drive, rear wheel drive or an all wheel drive, traction is determined by friction which is produced by the material of the tire and the tread pattern.

Snow tires are made to stay soft in freezing conditions, where normal tires actually get harder and lose traction in colder weather. (Even all weather tires get harder in freezing weather.) Snow tires offer better stopping and traction when accelerating. Whether you have a front wheel drive or an all wheel drive vehicle, you still need to stop! Snow tires will offer superior performance during our winter season and may even save you from using the auto body repair shop.

But remember, they are SNOW tires, so you will want to remove them when warmer weather returns.

What does investment landscape look like in 2012?

It's by no means clear how these problems will be resolved, so don't be surprised to see them lead to intermittent, if short-lived, shocks to the markets.

• **Election-year patterns** – As you're well aware, we're voting for president in 2012. But you might be surprised to learn that the S&P 500 index has shown negative returns in only three of the last 21 presidential election years. Coincidence? No one can say for sure – and at this point, no one can say if this pattern of positive returns will continue during this election year. Still, it's an interesting phenomenon.

So there you have it: the good, the bad and the quirky. Take them all to-

gether, and you still may not be able to foresee what will happen with the markets this year, but you'll have a lot to think about.

But instead of trying to predict what will happen in 2012, you may be better off following these tried-and-true investment strategies:

• **Diversify your holdings.** By spreading your money among a wide range of investments, you can reduce the effects of volatility on your portfolio. Keep in mind, though, that diversification, by itself, can't guarantee profits or protect against loss.

• **Don't ignore your risk tolerance.** If you worry excessively about market fluctuations, you may have too much risk in your portfolio, which means you may need to make some changes.

• **Always look at the "big picture."** Financial markets will always fluctuate. But if you can keep your focus on your long-term objectives, and make decisions accordingly, you can avoid overreacting to short-term events.

Like other years, 2012 will bring with it periods of both turbulence and smooth sailing. But by making the right investment moves, you can still chart a course that can allow you to move ever closer to your future goals.
